



**Chunky**  
**'Cosy Coastal'**  
**Triangle Shawl**

**Materials**

- 3 x balls of 'Marriner Empress Chunky' (80% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 100g / 138m)
- 6.0mm hook
- Stitch marker, yarn needle and scissors

**Tension**

13 sts and 7 rows to measure 10x10cm (4x4in) over treble stitches using a 6.0mm hook.

The finished shawl measures 190cm across and 42cm in depth

**Abbreviations (UK Crochet Terminology is used)**

**ch:** chain, **ch-sp(s):** chain space(s), **dc:** double crochet, **htr:** half treble, **mm:** millimetres, **RS:** right side, **ss:** slip stitch, **st(s):** stitch(es), **tch:** turning chain, **tr:** treble, **tr2tog:** treble 2 together.

**Pattern Notes**

The shawl is made in one piece beginning from left side point. Increases are made on one side until full width and centre of shawl is reached. Decreases are then made on the same side to create the triangle. You may want to use a stitch marker in the top of the turning chains making it easier to identify them as the correct stitch to crochet into at the end of the subsequent row.

**To Work**

Make 4ch

**Row 1** 2tr in 4<sup>th</sup> ch from hook (missed 3 ch counts as 1<sup>st</sup> st), 3ch (counts as 1<sup>st</sup> st of next row here and throughout – you may want to put a st marker in top of this ch), turn. [3 sts]

**Row 2** 1tr in next st (**not** the st at the base of the tch), 2tr in final st (increase made), 3ch, turn. [4 sts]

**Row 3** 1tr in st at base of tch (increase made), 1tr in next 3 sts, 3ch, turn. [5 sts]

**Row 4** 1tr in next 3 sts, 2 tr in final st, 3ch, turn. [6 sts]

**Row 5** 1tr in st at base of tch, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next st) 2 times, 1tr in final st, 3ch, turn. [5 sts and 2 x ch-sps]

**Row 6** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp, 1ch, miss 1 st, 2tr in final st, 3ch, turn. [6 sts and 2 x ch-sps]

**Row 7** 1tr in st at base of tch, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp) 2 times, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next 2 sts, 3ch, turn. [6 sts and x 3 ch-sps]

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**Row 8** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp) to final ch-sp in row, 1ch, miss 1 st, 2tr in final st, 3ch, turn. [7 sts and 3 x ch-sps]

**Row 9** 1tr in st at base of tch, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp) to final ch-sp in row, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next 2 sts, 3ch, turn. [7 sts and x 4 ch-sps]

**Rows 10 - 63** Repeat Rows 8 and 9 increasing by 1 st on each row along one side of shawl.

**Row 64** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp) to final ch-sp in row, 1ch, miss 1 st, 2tr in final st, **2ch**, turn. [66 sts]

We are now decreasing along the same edge to create triangular shape.

**Row 65** 1tr in next st (**not** st at base of tch, decrease made as tch was only 2 ch - you do not crochet into the top of this 2 ch on subsequent row), 1tr in next ch-sp, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp) to final ch-sp in row, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next 2 sts, 3ch, turn. [65 sts]

**Row 66** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, (1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp) to final ch-sp in row, tr2tog, **2ch**, turn [64 sts]

**Rows 67 – 120** Repeat Rows 65 and 66 decreasing by 1 st along one side of shawl.

**Row 121** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next 2 sts, 3ch, turn

**Row 122** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next ch-sp, tr2tog, 2ch, turn

**Row 123** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, 1ch, miss 1 st, 1tr in next 2 sts, 3ch, turn

**Row 124** 1tr in next st, 1tr in next ch-sp, tr2tog, 2ch, turn

**Row 125** 1tr in next 3 sts, 3ch, turn

**Row 126 (RS)** tr2tog, do not fasten off yarn. Continue with edging below.

## Edging

We are now crocheting along the triangular edges first with a simple shell stitch. Crochet evenly into the row ends. **You will not need to crochet into every row end**, just space your shell sts evenly along the edge.

Make 3ch, 5tr in 1<sup>st</sup> row end of shawl, 1ss to next row end, continue with \*5tr in row end, 1ss in row end, repeat from \* until centre point of shawl is reached (my shawl has 26 shells along one side). In central point of shawl work 1dc, 1htr, 1tr, 1htr, 1dc. Continue with shell st evenly up other side of shawl. At end of second side, make 2ch and crochet 2htr in each row end evenly across top edge of shawl, fasten off and weave in ends.

The shawl will benefit from wet blocking.
