



One Ball
'Fresh Breeze'
Hat

Materials

- 1 x ball of 'Marriner Empress Chunky' (80% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 100g / 138m)
- 6.0mm hook
- Stitch marker, yarn needle and scissors

Tension

This hat will fit a head circumference of approximately 57cm. 13 sts and 7 rows of treble stitches measures 10cm x 10cm. To make the hat in a smaller size change to a smaller hook and for a larger size use a larger hook.

Abbreviations (UK Crochet Terminology is used)

BL: back loop, **ch:** chain, **dc:** double crochet, **mm:** millimetres, **RS:** right side, **ss:** slip stitch, **st(s):** stitch(es), **tch:** turning chain, **tr:** treble, **tr2tog:** treble 2 together, **WS:** wrong side.

Pattern Notes

The hat is made in one piece. The ribbed trim is made first in rows of double crochet rib and then joined. The work is then turned by 90° and the rest of the hat is made in rounds.

You may want to use a stitch marker in the top of the turning chains making it easier to identify them as the correct stitch to crochet into at the end of the subsequent row or round.

To Work

Make 11ch

Row 1 (WS) 1dc in 3rd ch from hook going under BL of ch only (counts as 1st and 2nd sts – you may want to put a st marker in 1st st made), 1dc in BL of each ch to end, 1ch (counts as 1st st of next row here and throughout – you may want to put a st marker in this ch), turn. [10 sts]

Row 2 (RS) 1dc in BL of next st (not the st at the base of the tch) and in each st to end, 1ch, turn. [10 sts]

Rows 3 - 69 Continue as Row 2 working 1dc into BL of sts, at the end of Row 69 **do not** make 1ch, turn.

Row 70 (RS) To form hat brim fold work in half with WS together and first and last rows meet. Join this next row to Row 1 by working 1ss through both the BL of each st and each remaining loop from foundation ch to the end. Pay attention to crochet into the first st of the row. The trim is now complete. **Do not** cut the yarn. Turn work so the main section of the hat can now be made.

Round 1 (RS) 3ch (counts as 1st st here and throughout), 1tr in next and each row end around ensuring 2 strands are picked up to work into at the end of each row end, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**. [70 sts]

Rounds 2 - 4 1tr in each st around, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**.

Round 5 1tr in next 4 sts, tr2tog, (1tr in next 5 sts, tr2tog) 9 times, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**. [60 sts]

Round 6 1tr in each st around, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**.

Round 7 1tr in next 3 sts, tr2tog, (1tr in next 4 sts, tr2tog) 9 times, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**. [50 sts]

Round 8 1tr in each st around, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**.

Round 9 1tr in next 2 sts, tr2tog, (1tr in next 3 sts, tr2tog) 9 times, ss to top of 3 ch to join, 3ch, **turn**. [40 sts]

Round 10 1tr in each st around, ss to top of 3 ch to join, **1ch**, **turn**.

Round 11 1dc in each st around, ss to 1st ch to join, fasten off leaving 20cm tail.

To Finish

Weave tail of yarn through remaining sts and pull tight to close top of hat. Fasten off and weave in ends. With remaining yarn make a pom pom and attach to top of hat. ... Enjoy!
